Cracks in the system: Case studies and common themes

Inappropriate police response

0

- Incident not recorded at all, or recorded incorrectly
- Incorrect or incomplete police response compounded in court
- Identifying the victim as the perpetrator
- Lack of appropriate referral

Cracks in the system: Case studies and common themes

• 2/3 women were Aboriginal

0

- 2/3 women were unemployed or on a pension
- 2/3 women had a previous poor experience with police or courts
- All had a previous history of domestic violence with previous partners



Integrated Responses: Opportunities and Challenges

- Common risk assessment tools
- Common definitions for domestic and family violence
- Common training packages

To be applied across services, police and courts as well as across states and territories to work towards addressing the current inconsistent and uneven responses.

Integrated Responses: Opportunities and Challenges

- Developing tools and training whose voices are heard?
- Creating space for change from the bottom up models and practice tools - valuing lived experience, the consumer movement and models of peer support (or returning to second wave feminist roots)
