History of Murrigunyah

Murrigunyah began informally in late 1994 when a group of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Women came together and discussed the needs in their community. In particular, they were concerned about the support available to younger women. There were also concerns that there were no culturally appropriate counselling support services available in the Logan Community.

Who Are We?

Murrigunyah is the only stand alone Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander sexual assault support service in Queensland. The staff and Board Members are all women who identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander from the Logan City community and its surrounding areas.





- To provide a contact point for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women, men, youth and families;
- To provide support services through counselling, advocacy, practical assistance and relevant information;
- To facilitate a cultural link between women, men, youth and families to other services;
- To establish programs which are culturally appropriate for clients and families; and
- Community education workshops on issues surrounding family and sexual violence

Services offered at Murrigunyah

- Sexual assault preventative and support service
- Support counselling for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women, men youth and their families who are survivors or victims of sexual violence
- Court support
- Educational group sessions
- Information and referrals
- Act as a cultural link with other mainstream services
- Men's Group
- Young people dance group

Responding to Sexual Assault

Murrigunyah's response focuses on the provision of choice, control, safety and dignity for all survivors of sexual violence. Early intervention by staff who have specialised knowledge of the systems relevant to survivors, is considered crucial to minimising the short and long term impact of sexual violence.
